Improvement Plan Update

We have completed the work around planning and assessing in literacy and numeracy in line with the benchmarks. After Christmas we are looking at digital learning, including using this for profiling for upper school, coding, the introduction of Anytime Anywhere Learning (AAL) and reviewing our IT provision. We are in the process of drafting a leaflet with information on Reporting and Profiling with Parent Council support to sit alongside this work. We continue to work with cluster colleagues on a professional enquiry project of individual choice.

Mrs Cleland will be sharing some of the work we have developed around Dyslexia Friendly Schools approaches and you will be able to see how this is supported in classrooms.
